I. TRIBATE

Last week's three-way debate (or "tribate") with the rabbi and the imam went great. (Feels like I was just in the Middle East -- I, the unbearded one!) As the debate took place minutes after the Sabbath, the (Orthodox) rabbi walked a mile and a half to the venue, rather than accept a lift. He came with two of his sons -- theirs is a family of 11! The imam was very warm to me before, during, and after the debate. We even had a follow-up breakfast the next morning! All three of us agreed to hold the event again in New York (Rabbi Shmuley's territory) and Toronto (Shabir's adopted home).

Rabbi Shmuley Boteach (<u>www.shmuley.com</u>) is the host of the National TV show, "Shalom in the Home" airing on TLC (The Learning Channel), and the international best-selling author of 18 books. In Oxford, where Rabbi Shmuley served as Rabbi to the students for eleven years, he played host to, and debated, some of the world's leading thinkers, statesmen, and entertainers including Mikhail Gorbachev, Professor Stephen Hawking, Deepak Chopra, and Professor Richard Dawkins.

II. ROME 2009

The results are in -- thanks for your "votes" after the last newsletter. Italy edged out Israel and Greece for the location of the 2009 Biblical Study Tour. Highlights include the Coliseum, Catacombs, Sistine Chapel, Mt. Vesuvius (plus Pompeii & Herculaneum), the Pantheon, the Forum, and more...





The cost of our 2004 Biblical Study Tour to Rome and Pompeii was 750 euros (for all expenses except airfare). Five years later, a provisional estimate would be 900 euros. No deposit is required for another 6 months or so. At this time I need to know how many people can commit to Rome 2009. 
As for the 2009 International Teachers' Seminar, this will be separate from the Biblical Study Tour, and will take place in early November somewhere in North America, details TBA.

III. EARLY CHURCH HISTORY WEEKEND: "THE CHURCH AND THE WORLD," 19-21 September 2008

What did the early church really teach? What was their spirit of faith like in the 100s, 200s, and early 300s? And just how far have we drifted? What are the important lessons? Did you know that tens of thousands of pages have survived the centuries, recording the thoughts and faith of our early brothers and sisters? Want to learn more? (And meet David Bercot?)

Guest speaker at our Early Church History weekend is **David Bercot**. David has been a friend and mentor to me since 1995. His expertise is Patristics, the study of the Church Fathers -- those who lived their faith, often died for it, and fortunately (for us) recorded their thoughts. Bercot makes history come alive, never failing to stretch the mind and challenge the heart. (This is also the 2008 Continuing AIM event, for all current AIM students and graduates.)

- Theme: "The Church and the World"
- Speakers: David Bercot, Joey Harris, Douglas Jacoby, Steve Staten
- Date: Friday 19 Sunday 21 September 2008
- Location: The new church building of the North River Church of Christ, near I-75 in Marietta, a northern suburb of Atlanta.
- Early savings: Pay in June and save \$10.
- Regular cost (for those signing up in 1 July 31 August): \$100. This includes any and all days of the conference.
- Late fee (after 31 August): \$20.
- Discounts: 50% off for seniors and full-time students. Spouses of participants may attend for \$50.
- Housing: Available on a limited basis with members of the North River congregation.
- Preparation: Please go through one or more of the <u>recommended books</u>, including Bercot's *Real Heretics*, if you have not already read it.
- Exam option: For all current and former AIM students, as well as those who would like more accountability, there an examination will be available. (An additional examination fee applies.)
