17 March 2009 St. Patrick's Day

Dear Friends and Supporters,

I've just returned from an amazing trip to South America. Five nations and loads of good news! For example, at one of the universities, guests were at least 80% of the audience! In one church, I sat down after my sermon and asked my friend, "How many people today are visiting the church (non-members)?" He replied, "Over half." It is good *for me* to see the brothers and sisters so clear about their mission. Many are seeking God in this part of the world. In one of the airports, I received a Facebook message reminding me to keep reaching out. As this was on the return home, I felt fatigue (as I often do after a long trip -- entering a semi-vegetative state). As I was being searched in security, I took the brother's suggestion to heart, and reached out to two of the guards, remembering that even when tired, Jesus kept giving. (Thanks for the challenge!)

For me, the cities on the tour yielded not only many precious moments of fellowship, but also a chance to practice my Spanish. (Ellos quienes me escucharon saben que es feo, aunque yo trato mejorar la lenguaje.) There is so much good news, that in the next few issues you will find a series of short reports, beginning today with **Guyana**, the only English-speaking nation in South America.

Lately it seems the demand for creativity is high. I continue to record the weekly O.T. **podcasts**. Over a dozen have already been produced, the latest of which is *Rachel & Leah*. (Please consider **subscribing** if you haven't already.) Tomorrow I will teach on Moses in our local congregation, the North River Church of Christ (Marietta, Georgia). And on Friday we will host our next group Bible study. The topic: "Medical Ethics" (stem cell research, euthanasia, cloning, etc). It is easy to invite outsiders (Christians, Jews, Muslims, non-believers, seekers...) to our home for desserts, Bible study and discussion. Last month's group was very animated as we discussed "Crime and Punishment." Then on Sunday evening I fly to one of the most beautiful countries in the world, Norway (Oslo and Bergen), before teaching in the Spring session of the European Bible School in Stockholm.

In a few days my latest book, *Jesus and Islam*, will be ready to ship. I've worked hard on this over the last year or so, and am both excited about the material and eager to see how the challenges to the reader are received. Newsletter 5 will let you know once the new book is ready.

The rest of this bulletin includes the report from Guyana; information on a few upcoming learning opportunities; and last, a short article on St. Patrick's Day. (Yes, I'm one-eighth Irish, to be sure -- does that qualify me?)

REPORT FROM GUYANA (SOUTH AMERICA) 4-5 March, Georgetown, Guyana

For several years I had hoped to make it down to <u>Guyana</u>, one of the 13 nations in continental South America. The preacher in Georgetown began corresponding with me several years ago, and in 2007 we began working toward a possible trip. It was just a matter of finding the funding. In June 2008, confident that financial support would come in (it did), I booked the tickets.

Georgetown was the first stop on my March tour. A fire had gutted the church office and library, and after that, adding to the challenge, a flood soaked the building. (Guyana's sea walls are not very high.) I delivered as many books, CDs, and DVDs as I could carry. The teaching ministry donated over \$2000 of materials, nearly half of which has already been funded by donations from concerned Christians around the world. (Yes, there is still time to donate; just send an email.) The church was thrilled by all the gifts, and I enjoyed the fellowship meals with many faithful brothers and sisters. For me the visit to Guyana, a place well off the beaten track, was a reminder of how good it is to have friends close by (Proverbs 27:10). I should never take my local relationships for granted.

The following paragraphs are from a few of the leaders in the Georgetown congregation.




(1) "Hello, Douglas,
