This is hardly surprising, as the world in which the playwright lived was a culture immersed in the Scriptures.

Attend one of Shakespeare's plays: Anthony and Cleopatra.

Day 4 Thu 3 **After breakfast,** continue on to your next destination (not included).

Accommodation

It will be best to seek group discounts while leaving the bookings to each participant. We will be recommending several hotels in the area, and also see how many friends in London would be willing to put up a BST participant. This will be on a first-come, first-served basis only. The more centrally you stay, the better.

Local travel

Commute on the extensive London Underground, Bus system, or British Rail is also a viable option.

Meals

For those staying at hotels or B&Bs, of course breakfast will be included in the nightly price.

Lectures

These will take place in London's historic **St. Pancras Church**, which is in walking distance of the British Library and British Museum.

Sunday service

We'll meet in St Pancras Church for our communion service at 12:30.

Cost

- * For the main tour, the registration fee is US\$200. This is for registration only; there will be some extra costs (dinner cruise, admissions to some sites, and post-tour).
- * UK residents: £50. If you're hosting another participant from outside the UK, £25.
- * Europeans (outside UK): €0. Combinable with discounts above.
- * If you are coming from any other continent than North America: US\$75.
- * Spouses or other family members of participants, as well as full-time students: 50%.
- * Registration fee is nonrefundable.
- * At present 91 are signed up for the main tour.
- * Pricing for the excursion following the main tour is as follows:

POST-TOUR (Oxford and Stratford)

- * UK residents: Registration fee £25
- * Europeans outside the UK: Registration fee €25
- * North America: Registration fee US\$100
- * Other continents: Registration fee US\$30
- * There is a 50% discount for spouses, further family members, and full-time students.
- * Registration fee is nonrefundable.
- * Total price for post-tour \$540/person. Includes 3 hotel nights, breakfasts, transport, Shakespeare play, guides and admissions.
