The second (premium) website keeps growing, with 7 podcasts related to death and the end of the world recently recorded, as well as many other lessons. Touching lives

Of course the purpose of producing all this material isn't just to dump information into the

sea of human knowledge, but to change lives. Simply put, the goal is *transformation*, not *information*. Last

week as I walked around our neighborhood and presented free copies of my new book (Compelling) to believers and unbelievers, Christians and Jews, friends and strangers, I got into numerous conversations. Not just intellectual ones. We were talking about real life issues: health, the economy, divorce, children, politics, and more. Walks like these make me want to live in this neighborhood always. People need us as believers to share the truth that we have. Whatever level you consider yourself to be on, however much information you have about Christianity in your heart and head, never underestimate the impact you can make. I was also reminded of this fact during our home Bible discussion last week. People are searching, hoping, hurting -- aware of it or not, longing for people like you and me to take a chance and share the light that we have.

March speaking engagements

Despite the joys of personal (individual) conversation, much of the work of the teaching ministry is public. In March I was able to speak in Vancouver, Austin, and Atlanta. A special privilege was leading one of the morning devotionals at Habitat for Humanity, whose express goal is to rebuild 25% of the homes destroyed in the recent earthquake in Haiti. I will return in April to Habitat and continue to support their great work. In addition, AIM (our ministry school) took place in Marietta GA, focusing on N.T. survey and interpretation. Students hail from Florida, Georgia, Maryland, Tennessee, Massachusetts, Virginia, and the Carolinas. Earlier this week I traveled to Abilene Christian University. The short trek to Texas afforded some truly rewarding time with four professors (experts in the fields of theology, philosophy, psychology, and church history). During April I'll deliver a series of lectures at Georgia Tech (here in Atlanta), as well as teaching in Florida, New York, and Illinois. But more about that next month!
