

Vicki and I recently returned from our annual visit to Toronto. I teach Canadian leaders regularly via WebEx, but it's always better to personally renew our friendships face-to-face.

In writing news, this spring I gave a number of radio interviews to promote my new book from Harvest House Publishers, <u>A Quick Overview of the Bible</u>. I've also devoted a lot of time to research for my next book, *What's the Truth About Heaven and Hell?*, which will be released through Harvest House in 2013.

In April, we conducted an AIM session via WebEx for our students in Norway, Iceland and Denmark—18 classes in one intensive but inspiring weekend, all on New Testament Survey and Interpretation. In May, I enjoyed teaching more than 100 zealous college students from all over the Southeast at the North River Church of Christ's student internship program.

U.S. travel this spring has included visits with churches in Portland, Oregon; Sacramento, California; Nashville, Tennessee; Auburn, Alabama; and my hometown, Jacksonville, Florida. In May I traveled to Los Angeles, where I taught a mini-series on Jesus for the Coastal Region of the Los Angeles Church of Christ. Topics included history and apologetics.

I've also had the opportunity to attend two conferences for my own education and inspiration: The Pepperdine Bible Lectures, held at Pepperdine University, and the Christian Scholars' Conference, sponsored by Lipscomb University. Conferences like these provide exciting opportunities for spiritual growth, and for fellowship with other Christians and with scholars whose work informs my own. A highlight for me was spending time with Christian scholar and prolific author Jim McGuiggan.

In the weekly podcasts, I address biblical issues, along with world events and cultural trends that influence our worldview and thinking. Matt, who helped to start that church, was eager to return and minister to a congregation that does not receive many visits from disciples in other churches. Special Report: Mission Trip to Kuwait by Matt Anjilivelil



The Kuwait Church of Christ

On Wednesday, March 14, my wife Sandy and I flew out to Kuwait for a family reunion. We were going to meet our spiritual children in the Kuwait Church of Christ. It was a bittersweet visit for us, as we were back there to celebrate and memorialize the life of Rachel D'Souza, who had just passed away after a two-year struggle with leukemia. The three of us had started the church planting back in 1999. As mission teams were being sent out in the '90s, it became apparent that the only way to enter the Persian Gulf countries was to have a job offer. Disciples from the US, India, the Philippines, and other countries sought jobs in these nations, often not realizing the conditions they would be working in. Although some of us had good job offers, others worked as domestic help, or took other menial jobs. Many made untold sacrifices to get churches started all over the Gulf.

The church in Kuwait is comprised primarily of Filipinos and Indians, with disciples from the US, Jamaica, Jordan, and South Africa rounding out the fellowship. Worship is on Friday (the Muslim day of worship), and the disciples meet in an area hotel. Most disciples work blue-collar jobs and make less than \$12,000 a year (this is still a princely sum for people coming from Third World nations). Temperatures soar beyond 126 degrees Fahrenheit (50 degrees Celsius) during summers. In spite of these difficulties, the time of worship is truly a family time. Sandy and I were overwrought with emotion, not only from the joy of being reunited with our children in the faith, but also because of their love and devotion to us and to each other. There were 45 in attendance at the worship that Friday, and I could not help but thank God for the work he has done, starting with the three of us.

Pray for your brothers and sisters in the small churches who have left their families behind to brave harsh climes, racial bias, long hours at work, and deplorable living conditions, all while continuing to show their joy. They are real heroes!

We are very grateful to the International Bible Teaching Ministry for helping us make this trip and connect with the church in Kuwait.

These topics were not only fascinating, but the investigative approach used by Douglas proved enlightening to seasoned Christians as well as to those new to the faith.

We are truly blessed to have a growing friendship with Douglas and Vicki, and our Canadian family is grateful for the partnership with Douglas's teaching ministry.
