## AIM IV – MARIETTA, GEORGIA, 14-15 NOVEMBER

AIM, our ministry and biblical training school, was in session in the United States 14-15 November. What a tremendous time of fellowship! Eight speakers delivered 12 lessons on *Spiritual Life* – our most diverse session yet! Around 70 different students took part. I was personally challenged and refreshed by *all* the speakers. On the day of his arrival he taught on the topic *Genesis – Myth or Reality?*, for which the church had been preparing all week. On Sunday Douglas preached the word. The topic was *Staying faithful in hard times*, and came from 1 Peter. He reminded us how pain and suffering are integral components of the Christian life.
